Halloween 2006, Neatly Chiseled Features began with 26 online newspaper Web sites. We now have over 500 online Web sites and have expanded into IPTV (Online Television), Mobile phones, Sony PSP downloads, and Sprint (Fun Little Movies). Time-Warner has added our full-length features to their cable stations. Our first overseas market was the London Daily Mail, and we are now represented throughout every continent. Our animations are based on the internationally syndicated features Mr. Boffo, Willy n' Ethel, Cats With Hands, On The Edge, Porterfield, and Tucker, which have entertained newspaper readers for over two decades. Our short subjects have appeared at the Cannes Film Festival, our new, innovative concept has been touted by Paul Harvey, our animations were the focus of a National Smoke-Out, featured on the Lawrence Welk PBS Special, and Stan Lee has called it "the wave of the future". An Associated Press article can be seen on our Web site detailing how we've turned the comics into a profit stream instead of a cost factor supporting not only the newspaper industry but all online advertisers interested in truly funny content to promote their product.
